TOCCOA CITY COMMISSION
October 10, 2011

The City Commission of the City of Toccoa met in Regular Session at City Hall on Monday, October 10, 2011 at five o'clock P.M. with Mayor Janice English presiding.

The invocation was given by Phillip Teasley followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

- C. Consideration of Transportation Enhancement Memorandum of Understanding Authorization between the Georgia Department of Transportation

Motion by Commissioner Pavliscsak, seconded by Vice Mayor Austin and unanimously carried to authorize the Mayor to sign a Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Toccoa and the Georgia Department of Transportation regarding the City's Transportation Enhancement proposed project. The City of Toccoa had received \$325,000 for Downtown Toccoa Streetscape Phase VI. This is an 80% / 20% matching program, with the City of Toccoa pledging \$65,000 in a local match.

Mayor English announced that Finance Director Vickie Neikirk has resigned to accept a position in Hall County.
